Financial Hurricane Update

Thank you for your sacrificial giving to support Cooperative Missions in Mobile County and beyond. We are in better financial shape than we were this time last year. We still face financial challenges and will likely be accessing our savings again this year. As you recall, the Executive Committee said for us to access those funds as needed through these uncertain economic times.

For 2012, the DOM \$12k supplement has been reduced about 10 percent. The unofficial word is that the Church Development Ministries \$22k subsidy will begin the phase out in 2013. Church financial support to the association continues to reflect the economy. The first draft of the 2012 Proposed Budget reduces the program budget another \$10.6k, in addition to last year's \$41k reduction.

The Finance, Personnel, CWP, and IMC Committees are each looking at significant ways to decrease costs and improve ministries. We are going to have to continue to be creative in responding to increasing property and health insurance costs.

Preparing for the Hurricane

The Impact Mobile Associational Offering is part of a long term solution to changes in Cooperative Agreements. We are being encouraged by the GCR statement to provide locally for what was formerly returned to us through the Cooperative Agreements.

The best solution is for our members to faithfully tithe to their churches and our churches to faithfully tithe to Associational Missions and the Cooperative Program. Please consider designating at least 3 percent of your church's mission tithe to the MBA.
